

**City of Boiling Spring Lakes**  
**Minutes**  
**Board of Commissioners Emergency Meeting**  
**August 30, 2011**  
**City Hall - 6:35 p.m.**

**1. Call to Order** – Mayor White called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.

**2. Attendance:** In attendance at the meeting were Mayor White, Commissioners Caster, Troscianiec, Carroll, and Kinney, Interim City Manager Paul Sabiston, and City Clerk Linda Merry.

**3. Hurricane Irene, Debris Removal – Discussion**

Mr. Sabiston commended staff on their preparation efforts prior to the storm. He specifically recognized Public Works Director Larry Modlin for the great job he did with the lake levels.

He reported that there were approximately 200 cubic yards of debris due to Hurricane Irene. This would cost the City between \$ 6,000 and \$ 10,000 to remove. The FEMA declaration for Brunswick County does not include debris clean up, so the City would not be reimbursed.

Mr. Sabiston explained that a decision by the Board was needed immediately, before residents began to place debris beside the roads.

Commissioner Carroll did not believe there was enough debris to warrant a city-wide pick up. He reminded the Board that this was just the beginning of Hurricane Season and funds should be conserved in the event of a major disaster.

Commissioners Troscianiec and Kinney shared Commissioners Carroll's concerns.

**A motion** was made by Commissioner Carroll and seconded by Commissioner Kinney to not provide a city-wide pick up for debris resulting from Hurricane Irene
