9. Committee / Board Reports ~

a. Community Appearance Commission ~ Ms. Ann Hollingsworth, Chair Ms. Hollingsworth thanked city staff for the Christmas decorations and the Special Events

Committee for trimming the tree in front of City Hall. We are working on the entries for the Christmas properties. Entries must be in by December 15 and judging will be held on December 16 through December 18, 2020. Ms. Hollingsworth welcomed the new committee member, Barbara Reynolds. We hope to have information on the flags we are planning to place at the entrance walls. More information on that will be forthcoming. The Commission will not meet in January.

b. Planning Board ~ Bill Clark, Chair

Ms. Morgan reported the meeting took place on November 17, 2020; the zoning map amendment was reviewed for residential to C-1. Also reviewed were various UDO and text amendments and reviewed parking lot requirements for a major site plan.

c. Parks & Recreation Advisory Board ~ Barbara Bennett Snyder, Chair

Sheryl Johnson, Vice Chair reported the meeting was held on November 18, 2020. Seven Hundred and Fifty (750) residents participated in the Trunk or Treat event. Sara Goodwin of the Parks & Recreation department started a wellness and weight loss challenge; the winner should be announced around the New Year. Members discussed the Pedestrian Plan and we are all excited to see this project completed. The pancake breakfast has been cancelled due to Covid.

- d. Special Events Committee ~ Jackie Barker, Chair No report was given.
- e. Library Commission ~ Sherrie Kuzian, Chair

No report was given.

f. BSL Fire / Rescue ~ Chief Theresa Tickle

Chief Tickle reported the department responded to 41 EMS calls with 33 fire related calls. We are holding our Christmas tree sale, which is our largest fundraiser of the year, and it has been well received and appreciate all the support from the community. The Santa parade is Friday at 6:00 PM. If there are any questions regarding the route, give us a call.

Mayor Caster announced Commissioner Hall would be the Liaison to the Fire Department until further notice.

10. City Manager's Monthly Report ~ Jeff Repp, City Manager Mr. Repp reported:

- o As of October 31, 2020, the City had \$1,895,404 million dollars in cash and investments.
- o Sales tax revenue is 17.8% ahead of schedule, which is approximately \$151,000 in revenue.
- o Property tax collections have fallen behind; however, November is the big month, which has yet to be reported, as well as December.
- o Through the five-month period, which just ended, we received 25 new building permits this year. This is considerably ahead of schedule compared to the previous years. We should exceed 50 by a good margin by the time we get to July 2021.
- o Police Department renovations continue. We expect to have the 35% design criteria package this week. The design will be submitted to the USDA for their approval.
- O City personnel updates, Mr. Repp announced Suzanne Tungate is our new Finance Director from Elizabeth City. The Police Department hired Kristin Walsh who has started on November 23, 2020 as the new Administrative Assistant; Travis Duchene will be starting on December 10, 2020 as our new Animal Control Officer.
- Public Works, Jerry Edwards will be starting on December 7, 2020 as the new Maintenance Operator. Mr. Repp shared a reorganization of the Public Works Department.
- O Dam update the dams have been split into two different projects, North Lake Dam and Pine Lake Dam. The NC Department of Public Safety standards determined by FEMA are not to FEMA standards. FEMA will only participate to a level of rebuilding to the past specs. The Board requested letters to be sent to our Senators and Congressman for their assistance. McGill is preparing revised numbers and will be submitting these numbers to FEMA for their review and determination. We will continue moving forward with our schedule as planned.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING

CHAPTER 2 – ADMINISTRATION, ARTICLE II – MAYOR AND BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES FOR THE CITY OF BOILING SPRING LAKES BY DELETING CONFLICTING LANGUAGE WITH THE CITY CHARTER.

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners is required to appoint a sitting commissioner to serve as Mayor Pro-Tem; and

WHEREAS, the City Charter, adopted in 1977, specifies the duties and term of the Mayor Pro-Tem in Article III, Section 3.2; and

WHEREAS, the Code of Ordinances of the City is in conflict with the City Charter and the Board of Commissioners desire to amend the below sections of the Code of Ordinances to remove said conflict;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, THAT:

Section 1. That the following sections of the Code of Ordinances are amended as follows:

Sec. 2-29. - Mayor pro tempore.

At the first meeting of each calendar year, the board of commissioners shall select one (1) of its number to act as mayor pro tem. The mayor pro tem shall have a fixed term of office for one (1) year, but as such shall perform all the duties of the mayor in the mayor's absence or disability.

[The Board of Commissioners shall choose one of its members to act as Mayor Pro Tempore, and he/she shall perform the duties of the Mayor in the Mayor's absence or disability. The Mayor Pro Tempore as such shall have no fixed term of office, but shall serve in such capacity at the pleasure of the remaining members of the Board.]
