Chief's Message

I am pleased to present the 2015 Annual Report to the citizens of Boiling Spring Lakes. It is my privilege to work along side such a dedicated group of employees who are committed to our citizens. Our employees have continued to address the needs of the community through many challenges with determination and professionalism. This report will give the reader a glimpse into the activities and services that were provided by our agency during the past year and it will also identify goals and objectives for the upcoming year.

Significant events involving the Boiling Spring Lakes Police Department in 2015

- Collected over 41 pounds of unwanted medications in the Prescription Drop Box
- > Successfully secured over \$15,000.00 in Grant funds from the Governor's Crime Commission
- ➤ Hosted the 26th Annual "Small Fry Fishing Tournament"
- Co-Sponsored the Halloween Trunk or Treat with BSL Parks and Recreation Department
- Handled 5,080 Calls for Service P-11% increase from last year
- Filed Reports on 703 incidents/~38% increase from last year
- Investigated 90 Motor Vehicle Crashes
- Made 98 Arrests

Our best approach to serving our community is through collaboration with the citizens and fellow employees using the basic principles of community policing. The members of the Boiling Spring Lakes Police Department are committed to ensuring that we provide a safe community for all. We would like to thank the Mayor and City Council, the City Manager and his staff, City Department Heads, their staff and the citizens of Boiling Spring Lakes for their continued support.

The reassignment of personnel in 2015 and changing the makeup of the patrol shifts was necessary in order for the police department to better serve the citizens of BSL. The following changes were made to effectively balance each patrol shift with both experienced and inexperienced officers. Officers continue to work a rotating 12-hour shift with the exception of shift supervisors who are permanently assigned to work from 2P to 2A. Each rotation also has an officer who is assigned to work from 4P to 4A. The addition of two additional officers to each rotation would balance each shift with two officers and the supervisor remaining in the current position overseeing both shifts. Staffing levels continue to be a priority of the agency and an updated staffing proposal will be presented to the Mayor and City Council during the FY15/16 Budget Meetings.

Patrol Division

The Boiling Spring Lakes Police Department provides police coverage 365 days a year, 24 hours a day to the citizens of BSL.

In 2015, officers with the Boiling Spring Lakes Police Department responded to a total of <u>5,080</u> calls for service that were dispatched through the Brunswick County 911/Communications Center. This is an increase of 11% from 2014.

Internal records at the police department show that <u>4,071</u> events were logged by officers into our reporting software. This number represents an increase of 18% from 2014. These include calls for service, motor vehicle crash investigations, traffic stops, business checks, residential checks, animal control calls, and other incident reports.

Investigations

Property crimes including burglaries and larcenies continue to be the leading source of criminal activity in the city. 2,715 individual items of property were reported stolen in 2015 with a value of approximately \$171,000. Officers recovered over 36 items of stolen property in 2015 with a value of approximately \$5,000.

Officers work closely with investigators at other agencies in Brunswick County and meet regularly to share information on investigations. Another tool available to officers within the agency is LeadsOnline.

LeadsOnline is the nation's largest online investigation system for law enforcement, providing rapid electronic access to transactions from thousands of reporting businesses including scrap metal processors, secondhand stores, Internet drop-off stores, and pawn shops across the country, as well as critical information from eBay listings for criminal investigations.

LeadsOnline's cross-jurisdictional reporting and investigation systems, solves cases in literally seconds – from burglary to homicide. (www.leadsonline.com)

The "LeadsOnline" service has been made available to all members of the agency and it has already proven to be fruitful resource to patrol officers who can locate and track stolen property immediately without having to wait on an investigator to have the case assigned.

Traffic Services

In 2015 members of the BSLPD investigated 90 motor vehicle crashes in the city limits of BSL.

586 Traffic Citations issued by officers in 2015.

292 Warning citations were issued during 2015.

21 Arrests were made for DWI.

In addition to our duties involving domestic animals such as dogs and cats, our officers work closely with the N.C. Wildlife Commission with other animals such as alligators.



The Boiling Spring Lakes Police Department was the recipient of a **\$2,500.00** Grant from the N.C. Veterinary Medical Association. This money was used to make improvements and upgrades to our shelter facility. Some of the improvements included fans, lights, and new tarps that are used to protect dogs and cats from adverse weather conditions while being held at our facility.

Community Involvement

The Boiling Spring Lakes Police Department is dedicated to engaging with the community in numerous ways. The department supports youth programs, community watch groups, and other programs aimed at helping to improve the quality of life in our community.

Small Fry Fishing Tournament

Our agency hosted the 26th annual "Small Fry Fishing Tournament" in April of 2015. This annual event again brought the community together to enjoy a recreational activity that is vital to our part of the state. The tournament is designed for children between the ages 3 and 12 to fish along side local police officers.



NADDI Prescription Drop Box

A permanent drop box was installed in the lobby of the Boiling Spring Lakes Police Department in August of 2014, and is available to the public Monday through Friday 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM. Residents simply bring their unwanted medications to the police department lobby, follow the instructions located on the drop box, and discard their medications.

The Boiling Spring Lakes Police Department received the box at no cost through the National Association of Drug Diversion Investigators and a grant provided by Endo Pharmaceuticals.

This past year we collected over 41 pounds of medication in our drop box.

Students Against Destructive Decisions

In December of 2015 the Boiling Spring Lakes Police Department partnered with the Brunswick County Sheriff's Officer, Southport Police Department, Oak Island Police Department, Boiling Spring Lakes Volunteer Fire Department, North Carolina State Highway Patrol, and Brunswick County EMS in participating in the annual "Lights on for Life Day" at South Brunswick High School.

"Lights on for Life Day" was sponsored by the SADD club at SBHS and it encourages drivers to drive with their headlights on throughout the day to recognize those who have been killed or injured by impaired drivers and to remind the public that alcohol and drug-related crashes are preventable.

After-School Partnership with Parks and Recreation

Members of the police department join children in the afterschool program at least two days a week to assist with homework, read, or play games. The department has received positive responses from the children, staff, and other community members about our efforts at the community center.

We look forward to continuing our working relationships with the different committees and city departments and are planning additional programs for 2016 that will impact more citizens throughout the community.
